

**Jonathan Marshall, Revolutionary War Soldier of
Rutland County Vermont and Clinton County New York**

Revolutionary War Service

- Jonathan Marshall served 60 days in Captain Isaac Clark's Company of Militia from March 2, 1778 to May 2 1778. This company was raised upon the order of General Lafayette for the defense of the frontiers and on Lake Champlain.¹
- Jonathan Marshall served as a Corporal in Captain Parmalee Allen's Company of Rangers, Col. Ebenezer Allen's Detachment, for the period of February 1 to December 1, 1780.²
- Jonathan Marshall served 2 days in Captain Zebediah Dewey's Company in response to the alarm at Castleton VT June 10, 1781.³
- Jonathan Marshall served 10 days in Captain Zebediah Dewey's Company in response to the alarm at Castleton VT October 21, 1781.⁴

Residence in Vermont

- In 1790, Jonathan Marshall was a resident of Hinesburgh, Chittenden County

Vermont in a household with this composition:⁵

- Jonathan Marshall is recorded in the Vital Records of Hinesburg VT as a member in good standing of the Baptist Church of Poultney Vermont on December 6, 1791.⁶
- In 1800, Jonathan Marshall was a resident of Hinesburgh VT in a household with this composition:⁷

In 1810, Jonathan Marshall was a resident of Plattsburgh, Clinton County New York in a household with this composition:⁸

Jonathan Marshall is listed in the publication “Revolutionary War Veterans Buried in New York” as a veteran of the Revolutionary War, serving under Captain Dewey and Colonel Warren in the Vermont Rangers in 1777-8 who died May 1, 1830 at age 70 and is buried in the Village Cemetery in the Town of Beekmantown, Clinton County NY. His wife Phebe died March 8, 1831 age 66 is buried in the same cemetery.⁹ The grave of Jonathan Marshall has a headstone photographed in 2014 that at that time was clearly legible with his name and date of death. The 2014 image of the gravestone is shown below:¹⁰

DAR Patriot Ancestor Jonathan Marshall

Jonathan Marshall is DAR Patriot Ancestor #A073905, service Vermont, Sergeant, 15th Regiment. He is recorded as having been born December 12, 1762 in New Marlborough, Berkshire County Massachusetts and having died May 1, 1830 in Plattsburgh New York. His residence in Vermont is given as Poultney, Rutland County. His wife is identified as Phebe Ashley.

DAR members who gained membership based on the service of Jonathan Marshall proved descent from these children of Jonathan and Phebe Marshall:

1. Paul Marshall, who married Rebecca Smith.
2. Nathaniel Marshall, who married Betsey Pierce.
3. Lewis Marshall, who married Nancy Mead.

The death record of Lewis Marshall, who died in Williston Vermont on September 3, 1864 at age 70, lists his parents as Jonathan and Phebe Marshall and his birthplace as Hinesburgh VT.¹¹
