David Hanmore 1756 – 1831, Irish Immigrant and American Patriot

David Hanmore was born in Ireland c. 1756. He migrated to the New York Colony in British North America and enlisted in the 2nd Artillery Regiment of the Continental Army in New Windsor New York in April 1776. He was taken prisoner by the British at Fort Montgomery on the Hudson River in 1777. He escaped and rejoined is regiment to serve the remainder of his term. He lived in the Mohawk Valley region for most of his life after the war, and he died in Warren New York in 1831. No grave marker or monument has been found commemorating his service in the Revolutionary War.

Canajoharie and Minden are adjoining towns in Montgomery County New York in the Mohawk Valley region.

David Hanmore received a pension for his service during the Revolutionary War. In 1820 his pension payment was sent to Yates, Steuben County New York. In 1830 the payment was sent to him in Warren, Herkimer County NY.² David Hanmore died in 1831 in Warren NY.³ No burial records or grave site have been found for him.
