## Vermont Revolutionary War Soldiers with the Surname Adams

Aaron Adams served in Capt. John Spafford's Company of Colonel Ebenezer Adams

Regiment of the Vermont Militia. He served in the period 1780 to 1783. He enlisted May 31,

1780. He died December 13, 1833 in Obion County Tennessee.<sup>1</sup>

Abel Adams was paid for 2 days as part of a scouting party from Windsor in the

period June to September 1778 per the order of Major Ebenezer Woods. Abel Adams served

as a Corporal in Lt. Asahel Smith's Company of Militia who marched to Fort Solitude on

October 20, 1780. He served 13 days. He served 8 days in Capt. Savage's Company of the

3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Vermont Militia in the period August to October 1780.<sup>2</sup>

On April 17, 1789, Abel Adams purchased 4 acres of land in Windsor VT from Asahel

Smith, with whom he had served.<sup>3</sup> He was a resident of Windsor Vermont in the period

1790 to 1820. Abel Adams died July 21, 1821, and is buried in West Windsor Vermont.<sup>4</sup>

**Aaron Adams** served in Walbridge's Regiment of the Vermont Militia. His name appears on a payroll at Sunderland dated January 5, 1782. He held the rank of Sergeant and served for 8 months and 22 days. He was a resident of Salisbury, Addison County Vermont in 1790. He was a resident of Addison County Vermont in 1792. His wife was Sarah Heard, born June 1, 1757. Sarah Adams stated in her declaration for a pension based on her husband's service that he told her that he was present at the capture of Fort Ticonderoga and at the Battle of Bennington. Sarah stated that she and Aaron married on May 22, 1778. The children of Aaron and Sarah Adams are shown in the table below:

Benjamin Adams served in Warren's 15<sup>th</sup> Regiment, Vermont Militia. He appears on

a payroll from Sunderland dated April 12, 1782. He served in Captain Zebediah Dewey's

Company in response to the alarm at Castleton on June 10 1781. He served 2 days. He

served 10 days in the same company beginning October 21, 1781 in response to an alarm

in Castleton.6

Captain Zebediah Dewey died October 28, 1804 and is buried in East Poultney

Vermont.<sup>7</sup> Benjamin Adams was a resident of Poultney in 1781 and was taxed in that town.<sup>8</sup>

Benjamin Adams was a resident of Poultney in 1790.<sup>9</sup> No further information has been

found for Benjamin Adams of Poultney VT.

Daniel Adams of Ira Vermont served in Captain Lemuel Robert's Company in Col.

Lee's Regiment, appearing on a payroll for the period October 21 – 30, 1781 and also in

Robert's Company on June 10-11, 1781.

Daniel Adams married Eleanor Jackson on November 26, 1778 in Tinmouth Vermont. He took the Freemen's Oath in the Town of Ira Vermont at the inaugural organizational meeting of the town on May 31, 1779. Daniel Adams was a resident of the Town of Ira VT in 1790 in a household with this composition:

In 1782, Daniel Adams of Tinmouth, Bennington County VT, sold land in Bennington

County. Daniel Adams of Rutland County VT purchased land in the Town of Ira in 1791.

In the Bounty Records for Aaron Adams, Revolutionary Soldier of Salisbury, Addison

County Vermont, Daniel Adams is identified as a brother of Aaron Adams. This record

further states that Daniel Adams was in the Battle of Bennington.<sup>10</sup>

Daniel Adams had relocated to Cazenovia New York in 1800. He died after 1815. No information has been found for his burial.<sup>11</sup>

**David Adams** served in Ira Allen's Regiment of the Vermont Militia. His name is recorded on a payroll from Arlington dated January 9, 1782 and on a payroll dated October 1781. No further information has been found for David Adams.<sup>12</sup>

Ezekiel Adams served as a Private, Capt. Warriner Company, Cols. Barrett's

Regiment, Vermont Militia, 6 months service. He was born in Suffield CT in 1750. He

resided in Marlborough VT. He died in Cambridge NY in 1832.<sup>13</sup>

**Gideon Adams** served in Warren's 15<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Vermont Militia; his name

appears on a payroll for that regiment dated November 16, 1778 in Pawlet VT. He also

served in Ira Allen's Regiment of Vermont Militia. He is listed on a payroll at Arlington dated

June 6, 1781.<sup>14</sup>

Gideon Adams was the Town Clerk of Pawlet in 1777.<sup>15</sup> Gideon Adams was a resident of Pawlet VT in 1800; the only Gideon Adams found in Vermont in 1800.<sup>16</sup> He served as the clerk of the proprietors of Pawlet in 1800.<sup>17</sup> He also served as Town Clerk and Justice of the Peace in Pawlet VT in 1802.<sup>18</sup> He born May 11, 1743 in Canterbury CT and he died September 27, 1827 in Pawlet Vermont. His wife Mary died May 1, 1819 in Pawlet.<sup>19</sup> Gideon Adams, Esq. and Mary Adams are buried in the Mountain View Cemetery in Pawlet Vermont.<sup>20</sup>

James Adams served as a Sergeant in Captain Ebenezer Adam's Company for the defense of the frontier in 1776. He served from July to July 29.<sup>21</sup> James Adams married Sarah Calender on December 8, 1736 in Sheffield, Berkshire County, Massachusetts.<sup>22</sup> He died in Tinmouth, Rutland County Vermont May 22, 1787.<sup>23</sup>

Jeremiah Adams served in Captain Zebediah Dewey's Company of Militia for 4 days in March 1780. He served 8 days in the same company in October 1780. He also served 9 days in Captain Mosely's Company at Castleton in October 1781.<sup>24</sup> Jeremiah Adams was a resident of Poultney Vermont in 1790.<sup>25</sup> In 1800, Jeremiah Adams lived in Whitehall, Washington County New York.<sup>26</sup> He died in Washington County New York in 1816. No information has been found for his burial.<sup>27</sup>

Job Adams served in Captain Warren's Company of Col. Sergeant's Regiment of Vermont Militia. He served 3 days in December 1782 in this company.<sup>28</sup> Job Adams was a resident of Wildersburgh, Orange County Vermont in 1790.<sup>29</sup> The Town of Wildersburgh was later renamed Barre.<sup>30</sup> Job Adams was identified as a resident of Barre in an 1800 deed. No further information has been found for Job Adams.<sup>31</sup>

Jonathan Adams served as a Fifer in Captain William Hutchin's Independent Company. He enlisted November 20 1781 and was discharged May 1, 1782. This company was stationed at forts in Castleton and Pittsford.<sup>32</sup> Jonathan Adams was born September 20, 1765 in Canaan Connecticut. His parents were James and Submit Adams.<sup>33</sup> Jonathan Adams married Sally Daniels in Vermont in 1789.<sup>34</sup> Jonathan Adams was a resident of St.

Jonathan Adams sold his 153½ acre homestead farm in St. Johnsbury in 1792.42 He

died October 29, 1828 in Cayuga County New York and is buried in the Old Sennett

Cemetery in Sennett, Cayuga County NY.43

Joseph Adams served 10 days in Captain Zebediah Dewey's Company in October

1781.44 Captain Dewey's Company had several men, including their Captain, who lived in

Rutland County VT. Joseph Adams was chosen moderator for the Town of Pawlet

Proprietors Meeting on December 11, 1787. No further information has been found for

Joseph Adams.45

Levi Adams served as a Sergeant in Ira Allen's Regiment of the Vermont Militia. His

name appears on a payroll dated June 6, 1781 at Arlington VT.<sup>46</sup> Levi Adams was granted a

pension based on service in Vermont and Connecticut. He was born February 7, 1754 in Oswego, Dutchess County New York. During the war he lived in Canterbury, Windham County Connecticut and Pawlet, Rutland County Vermont. He resided in Ripley, Chautauqua County New York on October 15, 1832 when he made his declaration in support of his pension application. His description of his service recounts that he first volunteered on September 12, 1775 for service in Captain Butts Company while a resident of Canterbury CT. in the fall of 1776 he enlisted in Captain Kingsbury's Company while a resident of Canterbury CT. He later served in 1777 and 1778 in companies commanded by Captains Perkins and Hunt respectively.

Levi Adams further stated that in the first week of March 1780, while a resident of Pawlet, Rutland County Vermont, where he had moved a few days before, he volunteered for a company commanded by Captain John Stark. He served in another Vermont Company commanded by Captain Samuel Willan, in 1781 and 1782.

Levi Adams stated in his declaration that he was born February 17, 1754 in Oswago, Dutchess County New York. He lived in Pawlet VT until 1794, when he moved to Milford, Otsego County NY. He then moved to Ripley, Chautauqua County NY in 1826.<sup>47</sup>

**Martin Adams** served as a Drummer in Captain Brookins' Company of Fletcher's Battalion in June 1781. He also served as a Drummer in Captain Hutchins' Company in the period November 20, 1781 to May 1, 1782.<sup>48</sup> Martin Adams was a resident of St. Johnsbury

VT in 1790.<sup>49</sup> He resided in Duncansboro VT in 1810.<sup>50</sup> Martin Adams died August 8, 1839 and is buried in Newport, Orleans County Vermont.<sup>51</sup>
